They will work one-on-one with a case manager to uncover and address the reasons for their repeatedly falling into crisis.</p> <p>Residents of Forsyth and Stokes Counties in North Carolina who cannot afford their prescription medications may be able to receive them from our licensed free pharmacy.</p>	<p>CONGREGATIONAL LIAISON: To provide a strong proactive relationship by retaining, renewing, and nurturing the association between CCM and local congregations.</p> <p>INTERVIEWER: Collects information regarding the needs of individual clients through an interview process. When information is gathered, consultation with lead/staff is required.</p> <p>INTAKE RECEPTIONIST (Kernersville Office Only): Registers clients and records basic information.</p> <p>TELEPHONE RECEPTIONIST: Provides information to people calling the client services line, and directs calls to the proper staff and volunteers.</p> <p>FILE CLERK: Locates client files, assists telephone receptionist, re-files client records, etc.</p> <p>COMPUER CLERK: Enters client information into the emergency providers' computer network. Needs to be experienced and accurate, with a good working knowledge of Microsoft Office and database systems.</p> <p>FOOD ROOM ASSISTANT: Serves as a shopping assistant to our clients, bags food orders, accepts donations, and replenishes food room shelves.</p> <p>PHARMACIST: Must be a licensed pharmacist. Fills clients' prescriptions and provides medication counseling when needed.</p> <p>PHARMACY ASSISTANT: Answers telephone, greets clients, pulls files, pulls medications, does daily reports, checks expiration dates on sample medications, and shelves medications in alphabetical order.</p> <p>BULK MAILING ASSISTANT: On Call - Helps with bulk rate mailings, stuffs envelopes, labels newsletters, etc.</p> <p>COMMUNITY AMBASSADOR: On Call - Represents CCM at church and civic events. Attends volunteer recruitment events, answers questions, and provides general ministry information (including volunteer opportunities).</p> <p>SPECIAL PROJECTS (for individuals or groups - does not require on-going commitment)</p> <p>CRISIS CONTROL MINISTRY DAY AT THE DIXIE CLASSIC FAIR: October 8, 2008: Help with largest individual food drive of the year. Receive canned goods at the gates of the fairgrounds. Help unload filled trucks at ministry.</p> <p>FOOD SORTING (Nov-Dec): Sort and shelve donated foods received in large quantities during the holidays.</p> <p>HOPE DU JOUR (Feb-May): Deliver information to restaurants, make information buttons, and compile information.</p> <p>WEE CARE (Jan-Apr)</p> <p>VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION MONTH (Jan-Apr)</p> <p>KERNERSVILLE YARD SALE (spring and fall): Help with pricing and doing inventory of items, assist with set-up.</p> <p>GARDENING, GROUNDS CLEAN UP, ETC.; Help keep the grounds free of trash and manicured, weed and plant flowers</p> <p>*Most people volunteer for 1 shift per week (3 hrs) Training is provided for all positions. Meets weekly on Thursdays, 7:00-8:15 pm. • Complete an application process (for men only) to become a prison inmate sponsor so that you can take an inmate to a support group meeting at a local church once a month. Also you can sponsor an inmate to attend your worship service or small group meeting. • Join the Jail Bible study team and teach a class for female inmates on Thursdays. Should be willing to work a minimum of 4 hours/week. • Merchandising volunteers work a minimum of 4 hours per week maintaining the store sections, ensuring that items are priced, and assisting customers in lighting/electrical, furniture/office furniture, building materials and painting/hardware sections of the store. • Loading dock volunteers should make a one-day-per-week commitment. Teese Griffin, a member of 1st Presbyterian Church, is the contact and coordinator for this route. She may be reached at 761-1722. Volunteers deliver a hot lunchtime meal to homebound seniors in Forsyth County Monday-Friday. Delivery time averages 1+ hours. Volunteers deliver meals once a week, drivers deliver once a month. Volunteers use their own vehicles and make up to 16 stops per route.</p> <p>FROZEN MEAL DELIVERY: Another volunteer opportunity at Meals-on-Wheels is frozen meal delivery. This program provides each client with 2 boxes of frozen meals every other week. These meals are picked up at the Senior Services Center, 2895 Shorefair Drive. Volunteers are needed to deliver these meals on Tuesdays and delivery time is flexible. We believe that God calls us to serve Him and each other by working together and sharing the burdens and joys of life.</p> <p>Elliott Drake, Holly Lewis, and Steve Rowell are members of First Presbyterian Church.</p>	<p>Jack Larson, serving as director of short-term mission trips with Javier & Rosario de la Cruz, has been involved in mission in our church since the 1980s. In 1995, Jack led a First Presbyterian group to the DR. They were invited to visit the recently established 36-student school of Javier and Rosario. Margaret Wray, former First Presbyterian's children's director, suggested taking pictures of students hoping to find sponsors back home. This program has allowed the school to grow to 600 children attending preschool through 12th grade, of which over two hundred are sponsored by members of our church. Currently, there are many students listed on the website, hoping to be sponsored.</p> <p>Several of First Presbyterian's own members, Elliott and Lindsay Drake and Holly Lewis work with Mission Emanuel as full-time staff. Elliott and Lindsay moved to the Dominican Republic in 2008 to serve as missionaries to the Dominicans in the Nazaret and Cielo area. Elliott is now the Ministries Director managing day-to-day operations of the mission. Holly Lewis is the US Coordinator for the Women's Cooperative, works with the sponsorship program and also serves as Jack's short-term project assistant.</p> <p>First Presbyterian Church members including adults, college students, teens and children, have had the opportunity to serve as short-term missionaries to the DR, helping to build a school and a dental clinic in Nazaret, and a church, preschool, and the Mary Lynch Budd medical clinic in Cielo. The 2nd floor of our Medical Center opened in 2009 and provides physical therapy, pediatrics, dental care and community healthcare initiatives. Future plans include pre and post natal care, an apartment for visiting medical personnel, and family counseling services. The 1st and 3rd floors are still under construction.</p> <p>In addition to constructing buildings, the 500-600 short-term missionaries from our church family have been building relationships with our Dominican brothers and sisters. These life-changing mission experiences have served to build the body of Christ in Winston-Salem, as well as in Nazaret and Cielo. We believe that God has richly blessed the Mission and all who have been involved over the years.</p> <p>There are many ways you can become involved with Mission Emanuel. Weeklong mission trips are scheduled throughout the year: a women's trip in January, a college student trip on spring break in March, a men's trip in April, a family or high school trip in June, and an adult trip in October. If you are not able to be a part of a traveling team, you can become involved by sponsoring a child in one of the Mission Emanuel Christian schools. For \$35/month, a child is provided with an education, medical, and dental services. Additionally, you can be involved with Mission Emanuel by procuring medical supplies for the clinic. Mission Emanuel is also looking for financial partners in the ministry who can help sustain long-term development.</p>

Parent's Support group for the parent's whose child is faced with an unplanned pregnancy. <i>Worth the Wait</i> is a two part (medical and drama) program with a message of sexual purity to area eighth graders. We need male and female medical professionals willing to commit one or two hours per school term, usually in the early morning.</p> <p>One ongoing need is for trained female volunteer counselors to work one-on-one with clients for pregnancy test appointments. Training is provided semiannually during the fall and spring. There is a nominal fee for the manual which is due before training begins. Training consists of 10 classes taught by a staff member in a group setting. After manual training is complete a period of peer observation is scheduled. Ideally, a volunteer would be on the calendar for one day each week for a two hour shift arranged to fit her schedule. Thursday evening volunteers work from 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm once or twice per month. We especially need additional trained volunteers who speak Spanish. In collaboration with the Church of God and Prince of Peace Church SHM provides training for church planters, rural pastors and their church leaders via the OMEGA course - a practical church planting curriculum developed by United World Mission. We are currently capacitating 25 - 30 students with this 18 month course. The lack of secular scholastic preparation is a major obstacle in this effort.</p> <p>SHM also promotes and participates in children's ministries. Beginning in 2007 we began promoting AWANA (children's Bible clubs) within our target area. With two churches already participating we hope AWANA will begin to fill the great need for children's ministry within Guatemala where approximately 40% of its 13 million inhabitants are between 4 and 14 years old. SHM has a ministerial team which presents the AWANA program, provides the initial training, and then provides continual support once the program is implemented within a local church.</p> <p>In addition to these two major facets of ministry, we also maintain continual relations with the government orphanage, the government nursery and the local retirement community.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Short-Term Teams - Servants Heart hosts teams throughout the year to help build relational bridges within these Chorti communities. We specialize in family groups that come to participate in children's outreach. Construction teams are also needed, but require at least 6 months lead time to coordinate a "needed" project. Our teams consist of 10 people or less. Intercessory Prayer - Please pray that the Lord opens the hearts of the Chorti to receive the Gospel. Thank the Lord for the alliance of Guatemalan churches who have committed to this project. Also pray that the Lord will use the AWANA program to reach the millions of children who many times are marginalized by the church.
